Procedure to obtain Chapter 13 Trustee's consent to a motion for relief from the automatic stay to avoid filing fee under Local Rule 4001-1.

- •Do NOT include a signature line for the Trustee on the consent motion.
- •Prior to filing the motion, send an email to trconsent@ch13stl.com
 - (1) Attach to the email a copy of the proposed motion for relief from stay.
 - (2) Include in the email an affirmative representation that the Debtor's attorney has already consented to the motion (unless Debtor is the Movant.)
- •The Trustee's office will review the request within five business days and either:
 - (1) respond by email stating that the Trustee cannot consent to the motion or
 - (2) respond by email with a pdf consent form.
- •Movant must attach the pdf consent form to the motion when it is filed with the Court. If the pdf consent form is not an attachment to the motion, it will not be a consent motion and the Clerk's Office will charge the normal fee for filing a motion for relief from the automatic stay.
- •If the Trustee sends a pdf consent form, he will also mail to the attorney for the moving party a paper copy of the consent with a wet-ink signature.
